

MLA DOCUMENTATION Databases

Typically, the citation information for an article on a database is found either at the beginning or end of the article. If you print only part of the article, be sure to copy the citation information.

NOTE: If any of the information is not present for the source, skip that part of the citation and go to the next.

ONLINE DATABASES

Basic Format MLA 4.9.7

Use correct citation form for original source [i.e. book, magazine, or journal]. Name of database. Name of the service. Name of library, location of library. Day Month Year of Access <network address>.
